News Release

The police department responded to 508 incidents in the week of March 15, 2015 through March 21, 2015. The following is a brief summary of some of the more notable contacts:

Theft, 3/15/15, 8500 blk of Vernon Rd

A set of electronic keys were left on a tailgate. When the owner returned to get the keys the next day, they were gone.

Theft/Vehicle Prowl, 3/17/15, 8900 blk of 13 St NE

A 21 year old female reported her locked car had been broken into and her social security, bank card and other similar items were taken. There was no damage to the car.

Malicious Mischief/Attempted Mail Theft, 3/17/15, 3400 blk of Lake Dr.

Police responded to a 911 call with a report of a white male, who attempted to break into a locked mailbox, damaging the mailbox in the process. Two subjects left the area in a silver 4 door Saturn type vehicle after a witness yelled at them. The car had gold rims. No mail was taken.

Theft/Vehicle Prowl 3/17/15, 8700 blk of 11 St NE

A 35 year old male reported that his cars had been prowled while he slept. A Dell laptop and an iPhone 5 were reportedly stolen.

Vehicle Prowl, 3/18/15, 1900 blk of 125 Av. NE

A 29 year old male reported that someone had broken into his locked car and prowled through it. He found his car had been rolled back several feet and he believed the prowlers had been spooked away while attempting to steal his car.

Shoplifting, 3/18/15, 8900 blk of Market Pl

A 26 year old female was arrested for shoplifting \$80-worth of personal items from a local supermarket. The female acknowledged that she did not have the money to pay for the items when she entered the store. She was trespassed from the business and cited for shoplifting.

Criminal Impersonation, 3/18/15, 700 blk of 91 Av. NE

A 31 year old female was contacted after it was reported that she was aggressively panhandling at a local business. When the responding officer arrived on scene, the female attempted to walk away and avoid contact. After a lengthy conversation, the female was found to have a warrant for her arrest; she also provided extensive false information. She was booked into Snohomish County Jail for her warrant and she was charged with Criminal Impersonation. She was trespassed from the business.
