## **News Release**

The police department responded to 454 incidents in the week of April 5, 2015 through April 11, 2015. The following is a brief summary of some of the more notable contacts:

**Possession of Marijuana**, 04/06/15, 500 blk of SR 9

A 20 year-old male was contacted by an officer after the officer observed a suspicious vehicle. The male appeared to be sleeping at the wheel. The officer made contact with the male who appeared startled by the officer. The vehicle had a strong odor of Marijuana. When the male was asked about the odor, he stated his friend had been in the vehicle earlier and the friend had been smoking it. The male also gave the officer a few joints that he had in his vehicle. The marijuana was taken for destruction and the male was released from the scene with a warning.

**Assault/Unlawful Imprisonment**, 04/06/15, 9400 blk of 15 St NE

A 25 year-old male was arrested for assault and unlawful imprisonment. The male assaulted his 18 year-old girlfriend to the point she couldn't breathe. The male has controlling tendencies and would not allow the women to leave. The female reported the incident they next day. Charges were referred to the Snohomish County Prosecutor.

**Possession of a Stolen Vehicle**, 04/07/15, 2300 blk of 131 Ave NE

An officer observed a male driving erratically. The officer stopped the vehicle and a computer check revealed the vehicle was stolen. The male did not know who owned the vehicle. The 21 year-old male was arrested for possession of a stolen vehicle and transported to the Snohomish County Jail.

**Domestic Violence Order Violation (DV)**, 04/08/15, 9700 5 St NE

Officers were called after the 33 year-old protected party reported that the female have violated the order. Officers determined that a violation had occurred. A 26 year-old female was arrested for violating an active restraining order. The female was placed under arrest and was booked into Marysville Jail.

**Assault 4 Domestic Violence (DV)**, 04/09/15, 200 blk of 99<sup>th</sup> DR SE

Officers responded to a burglary complaint. It was discovered the male was actually attempting to get to his child who was inside the residence. The male was very intoxicated and the female, who was worried about the child's safety, would not release the child to the male. The male admitted he moved the ex-girlfriend out of his way so that he could get to his child and hit her vehicle with his hands. A 34 year-old male was arrested for assaulting his 33 year-old ex-girlfriend. The male was booked into Marysville Jail.
