Lake Stevens Farmers' Market 2020

This year brought the Lake Stevens Farmers' Market back to the city! Under the direction of Market Manager, Sarah Dylan Jensen, our inaugural year was a huge success and a boost to the local economy.

- Spanning 13 weeks for the summer market season: 71 unique vendors, averaging 54 vendors per month. The mid-season July 4th Saturday market: 33 vendors
- Total market revenue (all vendor sales combined): \$355,635
- The Harvestfest Market hosted 62 unique vendors; the Winterfest Holiday market hosted 70 unique vendors.
- Early sales numbers show that for each holiday event, sales are set to be 10-15% over an average weekly summer market, with numbers reaching approximately \$30K for the single one-day event.



Small Business CARES Grant

The City created an emergency grant program for our local small businesses from a portion of its CARES Relief Funds.

- The total amount given: \$841,861.46. This includes \$150,000 given to the Volunteers of America and \$15,000 given to the Lake Steven Senior Center for further distribution. This total reflects the first 4 rounds of grants. At the time of this publication, round 5 is still in progress.
- Grant recipients: 103 businesses
