## WSDOT begins night work on SR 9 between Fourth St. NE and Vernon Road

Crews from Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) will be installing new drainage and electrical systems on State Route 9 between Fourth St. NE and Vernon Road. The work takes place at night from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. Monday through Thursday. The work began January 30 and is anticipated to last until May. The area at State Route 9 and State Route 204 will be controlled by flaggers and police officers. Please proceed with caution.
