WASA award recognizes city partnership with school district

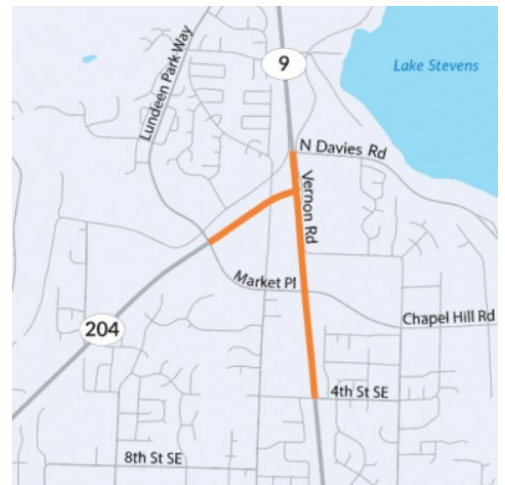
The Washington Association of School Administrators held its annual awards program on April 27. The Lake Stevens School District honored two students, an employee, and the City of Lake Stevens Public Works Department. Lake Stevens School District wrote the following about the Public Works Department:

Public Works recently completed several projects to improve traffic flow around schools in our growing community and are working to match student walk paths with potential sidewalk projects. WSDOT SR 9 and SR 204 Roundabout Final Stage

WSDOT has been in the process of improving the intersections of SR 9 and SR 204 by adding four roundabouts and widening SR 9 to two lanes in each direction. These improvements will help manage congestion and improve mobility, provide better access to area businesses, and provide more travel options with improved connections for pedestrians, bicyclists, transit users, and drivers. The final stage of construction for this project is now underway.
