


Remembering Councilmember, Marcus Tageant

116/117 Avenue NE Pilot Project

The city launched a Pedestrian and Traffic Safety Pilot Project on 116th Avenue NE and 117th Avenue NE to create safe walking paths and help reduce vehicle speed. This pilot is running from May 5 to June 5, 2025, and will change the street layout to reduce speeds and improve pedestrian safety. 116th Avenue NE is a one-way southbound, with the east side reserved for pedestrian use. 117th Avenue NE is a one-way northbound, with the west side reserved for pedestrian use.

The city will host an open house to go over the pilot project results. Residents are encouraged to stop by to share their thoughts and help shape the future of our neighborhood streets.

Have you noticed the banner and construction along Main Street? The City is embarking on a comprehensive project to improve Main Street infrastructure. The project includes new curb, gutter, planters, a multi-use path on the west side, and an improved sidewalk on the east side, along with much needed utilities upgrades. With urban design improvements aimed at uplifting the downtown atmosphere. Our mission is to create an inviting, sustainable, and vibrant city center. This project is not just about beautifying the town; it's about crafting a shared understanding of what our city needs and what it will become.

Construction along Main Street will continue throughout the summer Monday through Friday from 7 am to 4 pm with the a tentative end date of July 2025.
